Ingmar Karlsson was born on January 16, 1942 , in Smalands Burseryd, Sweden. After graduating from the Gothenburg School of Economics, he had a B.A in Political Science and History of Ideas and Learning at the University of Gothenburg in 1967.

In the same year, he entered into the service of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

In 1969-70 he was appointed as an attaché to the Swedish Embassy in Bogoto, Colombia. Next year he was the secretary of the Swedish Embassy in Vienna. After staying there for four years, Mr. Karlsson held the position of First Secretary in the Political Department of the Ministry with responsibility for the Middle East Affairs.

From 1979 to 1983 he was Charge d'Affaires in Damascus, Syria and in 1984-86 he became a minister in Beijing. Between 1987 and 1991 he held the same position in Bonn.

Since February, 1992, Mr. Karlsson has been working as an Ambassador and Head of Policy Planning in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.
