The study on Historical Peninsula has been dealt with in terms of Economic Space, Social Space and Geographical Space. Sectorial analysis on four different functional use has been studied :

- Commercial Activities, Cultural, Touristic, Accomodational and Other Service Areas,
- Residential Areas,
- Green Open Spaces and Recreational Areas,
- Transportation Areas.

This presentation attempts to explain the method of analysis on the 'Commercial Activities, Cultural, Touristic, Accomodational and Other Service Areas of Historical Peninsula' ; and focuses on Süleymaniye subarea. (*)

For the sake of detailed information, this analysis has been realized (performed) by survey in subsectorial basis in building lot scale. Data which profiles 'Land Use of Historical Peninsula -1995' reflects spatial relations of each subsector on economical, social and geographical space basis. The 'Synthesis' , 'Planning Approaches in master plan scale and for sub areas of Historical Peninsula', 'Strategies and Policies of Application' followed the analytical research.

Süleymaniye Subarea also has been analysed within this method which was decided for the analsis of the whole Historical Peninsula. The presentation of the two students of diploma project covers . the definition of the location and situation of Süleymaniye in Historical Peninsula in historical and spatial perspective, . values of land use by 1995, . variation in sectors, qualifications of buildings, and . synthesis of all data for the sake of planning approach of the area.

The objective is to attain a new economical, social and geographical space arrangement of Historical Peninsula harmonius with her distinctive historical and cultural identity. Also, it is expected to make a contribution in planning scale (in terms of planning decisions, planning policies and strategies for application) to the Süleymaniye Workshop.
